



G. Dodd Galbreath is founding Executive Director of Lipscomb University's Institute for Sustainable Practice. The Institute offer's Tennessee's first academic program in sustainability with a Master of Business Administration, Master of Science, graduate certificate, and an undergraduate major and minor in sustainability.

Dodd gives graphic presentations and facilitates sustainability applications in corporate, public policy, private development, historic preservation, outreach and faith based settings. He was also trained as one of "The Climate Project" volunteer presenters, giving the slide show developed by former Vice President Albert Gore, Jr. He currently serves in two mayoral appointments for the City of Nashville in open space preservation and stormwater management.

While working for two governors, Dodd led passage of laws to manage water transfers between southeastern rivers and to add transparency to in-state water uses. He also has unique expertise in state policy and planning for wetlands conservation and in environmental justice, and in the development of design standards for sustainable storm water systems.
